Political Update

31st January 2020

- The UK formally left the European Union (EU) on the 31st January 2020.
 - As agreed in the Withdrawal Agreement the UK entered a transition period. This is due to last until 31st December 2020.
 - During the 11-month period the UK will continue to follow all of the EU's rules and its trading relationship will remain the same.
 - During this time both the UK and EU will negotiate a new free trade agreement.
- A new free trade agreement is required because:
- The UK will leave the single market and customs union at the end of the transition period.
- A free trade agreement will allow goods to move around the EU without checks and extra charges.
- If a new free trade cannot be agreed during the transition period then the UK faces the prospect
 of having to trade with no deal in place.
 - The prospect of a "No Deal" scenario



Political Update

31st January 2020

- Under the deal agreed between Boris Johnson and EU was an agreement about the Northern Ireland backstop.
 - The key change is
 - To effectively create a customs border between Northern Ireland and Great Britain.
 - Some goods entering Northern Ireland from Great Britain will be subject to checks and will have to pay EU import taxes (tariffs).
 - These would be refunded if the goods remain in Norther Ireland and not moved to the Republic of Ireland


How customs might work





Introduction

PREREQUISITE NOTES

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BASIC

In a referendum held on June 23, 2016, the majority of people voted in favour of the United Kingdom leaving the European Union (EU, a union of 28 European member countries).

The subsequent process of withdrawal of the UK from the EU is commonly referred to as Brexit. The process of separation was started by the UK government invoking Article 50 of the Treaty on the European Union on March 29, 2017. The details of the new relationship between the UK and the EU are currently under discussion and so are subject to complex negotiations. According to Article 50, the process of Brexit is scheduled to conclude at the end of March 2019.

Changes resulting from Brexit, with potential impacts on SAP, can be expected in the areas of tax, reporting, employment rights and goods movement among many others. SAP recognizes these potential changes and is closely monitoring the situation and analyzing the impact for SAP customers and partners, primarily those using the current United Kingdom / Ireland localizations.

SAP will continue to monitor the governments negotiations and will deliver patches only for selected updates and releases at its own discretion, based on the business impact and the complexity of the implementation.

Symptom

The UK triggered Article 50 of the Treaty of the European Union on 29 March 2017. As set out under that treaty, the UK had two years to negotiate a Withdrawal Agreement and framework for a future relationship with the EU before the point of the UK's exit from the EU at 11pm GMT on 29 March 2019.

If the Withdrawal Agreement is ratified, the deadline for agreeing the terms of the UK's future relationship with the EU will move to 31 December 2020.

A no deal scenario, also called "hard" Brexit, is one where the UK leaves the EU and becomes a third country at 11pm GMT on 29 March 2019 without a Withdrawal Agreement and framework for a future relationship in place between the UK and the EU.

Reason and Prerequisites

The UK leaving the EU will affect several processes and will have an impact on reporting.

Solution

This note provides general guidelines about the impact of a no deal scenario on SAP standard functionality. Customers specific developments cannot be considered.

This note will be supplemented with more specific notes, in terms of different areas and/or products, that are listed in the "References" section of this note. Please refer to SAP note 2768412 for more details about a list of technical action items and time of execution. Please also check for regular updates of this note.

The impact of Brexit could occur in the following areas:

1. Changes in configuration

a. Deactivation of EU-flag for UK in table T005 (=definition of countries)

b. Maintenance of VAT registration numbers

i. Based on the current information from HMRC, no changes are expected in the format of the VAT registration numbers for UK (starting with GB). This would mean that no particular changes are necessary in the maintenance of domestic and foreign VAT registration numbers for UK (starting with GB).

Symptom

The UK triggered Article 50 of the Treaty of the European Union on 29 March 2017. As set out under that treaty, the UK had two years to negotiate a Withdrawal Agreement and framework for a future relationship with the EU.

The Withdrawal Bill was passed by the UK Parliament, has received Royal Ascent and became law on the 23rd January. On the 24th of January it was also ratified by the EU leaders. This means that Article 50 can no longer be revoked and the UK will leave the EU on 31st January 2020 with the withdrawal agreement.

But that will not be the end of the Brexit story.

The UK will enter a transition period until 31 December 2020.

The purpose of the transition period is to enable a new wave of UK-EU negotiations to take place. These talks will determine what the future relationship will eventually look like.

Reason and Prerequisites

The UK leaving the EU on the 31st January 2020 with the Withdrawal Bill

Solution

During this transition period, although the UK will cease to be an EU member, the trading relationship will remain the same and it will continue to follow the EU's rules.
